TROSA awarded over \$4,000 in donations from Summer Symposia Series at The Forest at Duke

DURHAM, NC, JULY 31, 2018 – The Forest at Duke, a vibrant continuing care retirement community located in the heart of Durham, welcomed guests for Symposia, a summer program of lectures and guest speakers. Each year, the summer programs highlight and support a local nonprofit and we are pleased to share that TROSA (Triangle Residential Options for Substance Abusers, Inc.) has been selected as the beneficiary nonprofit for summer 2018.

Organizers collected tuition fees, 100% of which were donated to TROSA. Between program tuition and direct donations, attendees donated over \$4,000 to TROSA to help further their mission and vision.

TROSA is an innovative, multi-year residential program for men and women with substance use disorder, providing comprehensive treatment, vocational training, education opportunities, health care, and continuing care - all at no cost to those they serve.

The summer series closed today with a special presentation by Brian Buland, Associate Director for Special Projects at TROSA. Mr. Buland discussed TROSA, its positive societal and economic impacts, and statistics and challenges facing the country regarding the opioid epidemic.
